Common problems in advanced Parkinson's disease

Dr. Chandi Das

Senior Staff Specialist in Neurology at the Canberra Hospital, Australian Capital Territory (ACT) Health, Canberra, Australia

Dr Chandi Das has special interest in the field of Movement Disorders and Parkinson's Disorders. He is an Executive Committee member (ACT representative) of the Movement Disorder Society of Australia and New Zealand (MDSANZ) and also of the MDSANZ Clinical Research Network (CRN) for last 10 years, and Chairman of the Parkinson's Disease Steering Group of ACT Health. He undertook a fellowship in Movement Disorders at Westmead Hospital, Sydney, Australia in 2007-2008. He graduated from SCB Medical College, Cuttack, worked in Calcutta Medical Research Institute (CMRI), Calcutta before completing MD in Internal Medicine. He received DM in Neurology at Post Graduate Institute of Medical Education and Research (PGIMER), Chandigarh in 1997. He joined as a faculty in PGIMER, and during that time he supervised and guided trainees in MD Medicine and DM Neurology, including thesis work. Thereafter he moved to Australia 2007. He has published over 50 research papers in peer reviewed journals, chapters in books and presented research papers.

Dr B N Gangadhar has completed his MD Psychiatry from National Institute of Mental Health and Neurosciences (NIMHANS) in 1981 and DSc (Doctor of Science) from SVYASA University in 2012. He has been a Guide/co-guide to nearly 60 MD and PhD trainees. His main research areas include Yoga, Schizophrenia, Public Health, Electroconvulsive therapy. He has been awarded Sir CV Raman Award from Karnataka Government and Padmashri by the Government of India.
